The County Lake Board is working on a plan to assist farmers upstream with controlling the influx of pollution. The Board is also working with Camp Echo for the placement of an advisory sign at the creek mouth. Please be advised that you SWIM AT YOUR OWN RISK in this area.

Buoys: Red buoys are placed in areas with shallow water. These include the three "sunken" islands, several points along the East shore, along the camp property, the West shore point, and flats roughly from Zuchowski's to south of Hindes'. ALL these areas are very shallow and should be avoided by boat traffic unless docking at your residence. Staying outside the annual placement of swim docks around the lake is a good "rule of thumb" if buoys are NOT in place.

Watercraft: Your Ryerson Lake Association Board is sharing the following information as a "head's up" to State-wide DNR rules that might be implemented in the future. As the Ryerson Lake Association Board we do not have jurisdiction nor ability to enforce these DNR recommendations.

The Michigan DNR is proposing larger shoreline buffers and lake depth requirements for wake boats. Ski boats and other watercraft are not affected by this proposal. An MLive article on September 24, 2022 stated "In a September 1, 2022 report, DNR fisheries officials recommend [wake] boats operate at least 500 feet from docks or shoreline and in at least 15 feet of water to prevent lake bottom scouring, shoreline erosion and dock damage from their wakes." This information was also attached to your lake weed assessment statement mailing. Shown is a computer-generated map indicating approximately 500 feet from the shore (not docks) and water depths of at least 15 feet. The shaded portions represent the only two areas where wake boating would be viable. Note the small size and that they are

not connected would make it nearly impossible for a wake boat to stay within the DNR recommendations. Our lake is extremely narrow and just 250 acres. Again, these are DNR RECOMMENDATIONS ONLY. They are not a law nor enforceable at this time, however we remind ALL boaters and skiers to stay at least 100 feet from shore, docks and swim rafts.
